The rooms inside the building are decorated with beautiful archways and precious stones in the walls. The buildings are surrounded by gardens with pathways, pools, fountains and green gardens.

The construction of the Taj Mahal began in 1632 and finished in 1653. It was built with materials from all ov India and Asia, but the main material is white marble. Historians believe that the materials were transported over 1,000 elephants for the construction.


